**SESSION 6** - Renewing Your Mind In The Truth

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


As we enter the sixth week of our study, we are focusing on practical ways to live free of cultural captivity, the accepted ways of thinking and acting in our society. Satan working through our society is relentless; never letting up on barraging our minds with the way we should think in this post-modern world. How can we develop our defenses against his constant attacks so that we can focus our attention on sharing the eternal good news with others?

# **FAST FACTS**

How common is it for people to profess a different religious affiliation in 2020 than the one they grew up under as a child?

- About three out of four (73%) adults under the age of 40 who said their family affiliated with a Protestant or Catholic church as a child still currently affiliate with a Christian church of some type. Thus, about one fourth of these children no longer affiliate with a Christian church.
- Americans under 40 who currently express being born-again Protestants represent about one in six (16%) of our population. Of these born-again Protestants, over half (58%) were Evangelicals as children while about one in four were Mainline Protestants, one in ten were Catholics and the rest either Other Religions or Unaffiliated.



• Americans under 40 who currently express being Unaffiliated represent almost one in three (29%) of our population. Of these current Unaffiliated, more than one in three (40%) were Unaffiliated as children while another one in three (33%) were

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Protestants, one in five (19%) were Catholics and the rest (8%) were Other Religions. So, we see a large majority, 60%, of the Unaffiliated did not grow up in a home that professed to be Unaffiliated.

# **LEADING THE SMALL GROUP SESSION**

# Begin with whatever fellowship time (if any) you normally include in your small group time.

Begin the session by asking one of the group members to lead in a prayer specifically asking for God's presence and leadership during this time. Pray that we will be open to God's word recorded in Scripture as a guiding light for our lives. Pray that the Bible will be more than a holy book; that it will be God's truth to guide our thoughts and actions.

1. If you had to leave your home suddenly never to return, what are the top three things you would try to take with you (family members are excluded)?

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# **Group Teaser Questions**

- 2. Have you ever been on an outing and realized that your phone's battery was not going to last and you had forgotten your charger?
  - How did you feel knowing you were going to be disconnected from family and friends that might need to reach you?
- 3. If the Word of God is our power source, what are things we can do to make sure we are fully charged and ready to go?
- 4. Ask someone to share an experience where knowing what the Bible says made a difference in dealing with a life situation?

# **Group Discussion Questions**

- Read Romans 12:2 & Eph. 2:10. (In Periscope Chapter 36) How can we be 'his workmanship' and yet still have the possibility of being 'conformed to this present world'? Do we need to continually renew our mind if we are going to walk in the good works God has prepared for us? [Chapter 36 of Periscope begins with Romans 12:2 "Do not be conformed to this present world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may test and approve what is the will of God—what is good and well-pleasing and perfect."]
- 2. Read Phil. 1:9-11. Discernment is the ability to apply our knowledge to new situations. If we are not to be fooled by the world's lie, we need spiritual discernment.
  To be prepared for the day of Christ, what does our discernment need to produce in our lives?
  Can you think of an example where discernment is needed to apply

the truth of Christ to a worldly situation? ["And it is my prayer that your love may abound more and more, with knowledge and all discernment, so that you may approve what is excellent, and so be pure and blameless for the day of Christ filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ, to the glory and praise of God." How can you reconcile these verses with what was said in the verses immediately preceding these? What is the key thought in these verses to living an eternal life that brings glory to God?]

 Do you think many Christians today are biblically illiterate? How can you discern biblical illiteracy?
 Is it possible to encounter areas where you feel illiterate and then go to the Bible to gain knowledge?

PRESS PLAY on the Video to continue. 1) The questions at the end have 2 sets.
2) HIT PAUSE when you reach the questions near the end. 3) When you complete those questions, PRESS PLAY and let it run to the end. After completing those questions, close the video window. Rewind if necessary.

# **Group Discussion Questions**

- 4. Read 2 Tim. 3:16-17. What does it mean to say that Scripture is "breathed out by God"? If a passage of Scripture has ever reproved or corrected them, ask one or two to share about their experience. [The key verse in this section is 2 Timothy 3:16-17 "All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work.]
- 5. Read Ephesians 2:10. If we are "created for good works", why do we need to be "equipped for every good work"? [Ephesians 2:10 says that in Christ we are created 'for good works' while the passage above says that we may be 'equipped for every good work'. How do these concepts work together to give us a complete picture of God's work in the lives of Christians.]
- 6. Read 2<sup>ND</sup> Peter 1:3-4. Can we have a knowledge of Him and His precious and very great promises without a working understanding of the Bible? To escape from the corruption of the world what do we need to do? [Periscope Chapter 41 points to the result of knowing Christ as expressed in 2<sup>ND</sup> Peter 1:3-4: "His divine power has granted to us all things that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge

of him who called us to his own glory and excellence by which he has granted to us his precious and very great promises, so that through them you may become partakers of the divine nature, having escaped from the corruption that is in the world because of sinful desire."

- 7. How did the man in the video know the painting was going to turn out looking like Jesus?
  How can we make sure our actions paint a picture of Jesus Christ when viewed by those around us?
  Is the total picture painted by us alone or do we require others in the body of Christ to create a full view of Christ?
- 8. Can we do it alone or do we need others within the church to come along side us?
